

Reflection on (John 4:42):


"Now we believe, not because of what you said, for we ourselves have heard Him and we know that this is indeed the Christ, the Saviour of the world."

In order to fully comprehend this verse, it is important to understand the context first. Jesus had a conversation with a Samaritan woman, while His disciples were in town buying food. Throughout the conversation, Jesus revealed his deep knowledge regarding the Samaritan woman's past, one that many considered to be "unclean." However, this Samaritan woman had immediate faith in Jesus after her conversation with Him, and her testimony to the public encouraged many people to meet Jesus.
